

The BP Petroleum Engineering Honours Project Prize

Establishment

This Prize has been established by a contribution to the University by BP Australia Pty. Ltd in recognition of high achieving Honours students in the field of petroleum engineering studying with the Australian School of Petroleum.

In support of the prize BP Australia Pty. Ltd. shall provide to the University an annual amount of \$500.00 (GST free).

Value

The value of the Prize will be \$500.00 per year for 5 years until otherwise determined by the University after discussions with the contributor.

Eligibility

The prize will be awarded annually by the University to eligible students enrolled in one of the following degrees:

- Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Petroleum)
- Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Petroleum and Chemical)
- Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Petroleum and Mechanical)
- Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Petroleum and Mining)
- Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Petroleum, Civil and Structural)
- Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Petroleum) and Bachelor of Science

Selection of Candidate

The Head of the Australian School of Petroleum (or nominee) will award the prize to the student or group of students who complete a project deemed to be of the highest academic quality amongst those eligible for the prize.

If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in a given year then the prize will not be awarded in that year and the money will be used in subsequent years.

If the prize is awarded to a group of students, the value of the prize shall be shared equally among those students in the group.

If there is more than one candidate or group of equal merit, then the prize shall be shared equally.

Variations

The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the original objectives of the prize.
