Applications are invited for the following scholarship leading to the degree of Master of Philosophy or PhD in the School of Agriculture, Food and Wine.

The scholarship is supported by internal funds.

Field of Study: The metagenomics, microbial ecology and chemistry of fermentations of plant extracts by Australian Aboriginal people: A national survey of representative process found across Australia.

Eligibility: Applicants must be Australian Citizens or permanent residents of Australia who are acceptable as candidates for a Master of Philosophy or PhD degree at the University of Adelaide. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people are encouraged to apply. Applicants must also be able to secure a primary scholarship.

Stipend: The scholarship will be for up to 2 year for a Master of Philosophy or up to 3 years for a PhD and has a stipend of \$5,000 per annum. It is likely to be tax exempt, subject to Taxation Office approval.
