Eligibility

The Prize will be awarded annually. To be eligible for the Prize, candidates must have successfully completed the Food & Nutrition Science Industry Placement course at the University of Adelaide in the year prior to the Prize being awarded.

Candidate Selection

The Program Management Committee, Industry Placement Course Coordinators and a representative from Food South Australia shall award the Prize to the candidate who is deemed by the Committee to be the best student who successfully completed the Food & Nutrition Science Industry Placement course taking into account academic merit and other qualities.

If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in a given year then the Prize Package will not be awarded in that year.

Variations
