

R.K. Morton Scholarship

In 1965, £2,000 was given to the University by members of the Australian Biochemical Society and other friends and colleagues of the late Robert Kerford Morton, F.A.A., Waite Professor of Agricultural Chemistry in the University from 1957 to 1962 and Professor of Biochemistry in 1963, to establish a fund in his memory.

Prize rule

Value

The value of the scholarship shall be \$1,500 per year, or such other amount as the University shall from time to time determine provided that the value of the scholarship does not exceed the annual distribution of interest available from the Endowment Fund.

Eligibility

Student in an Honours degree undertaking a research project related to agricultural biochemistry in the School of Agriculture, Food and Wine.

Candidate Selection

The undergraduate placed highest in order of merit amongst those candidates who have completed the third year course Plant Biotechnology III and who proceeds to an Honours degree undertaking a research project related to agricultural biochemistry in the School of Agriculture, Food and Wine.

If in any year the Faculty of Sciences considers that no candidate is of sufficient merit no award will be made.

Variations

The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent wit the University's legal obligations and policies.
