Prize rule

Value

The value of the Prize will be \$500.00 per year for 3 years until otherwise determined by the University after discussions with the donor.

Eligibility

The Prize is awarded by the University annually and on the following eligibility criteria:-

- to students who have completed the BFNS Program at the University of Adelaide.

Candidate Selection

The Program Management Committee (consisting of the Program Coordinator - BFNS Program (Chair); at least 2 BFNS Course Coordinators; Deputy Head, Learning & Teaching at Waite and the Faculty's Senior Academic Support Officer) will award the prize to the graduating student from the BFNS Program whose academic merit, personal qualities, enthusiasm and aptitude indicate the promise of an outstanding contribution to the food and nutrition industry.

If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in any given year then the Prize will not be awarded in that year.

Variations
