

The School of Mathematical Sciences First Year Mathematics Prize PRIZE RULES

Establishment

This prize was established as a result of a contribution by the School of Mathematical Sciences to recognise academic achievement by first year students in the School of Mathematical Sciences.

The capital for the prize is held in perpetuity resulting in the minimum annual prize distribution paid from the Endowment Fund.

Value

The value of the Prize will be \$250.00 per year, or such other amount as the University shall from time to time determine provided that the value of the prize does not exceed the annual distribution of interest available from the Endowment Fund¹.

Eligibility

The prize will be awarded annually by the University to a student who meets the following criteria.

- a) The student is enrolled in one of the following degrees:
Bachelor of Mathematical and Computer Sciences or a double degree with a Bachelor of Mathematical and Computer Sciences component
Bachelor of Mathematical Sciences
Bachelor of Mathematical Sciences (Advanced)
- b) The student has completed the course MATHS 1012 Mathematics IB in the year for which the prize is awarded.

Selection of Candidate

The Head of the School of Mathematical Sciences will award the prize to the eligible student with the highest average mark in MATHS 1011 Mathematics IA and MATHS 1012 Mathematics IB.

If there is more than one candidate of equal merit, then the prize shall be shared equally.

Variations

The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the original objectives of the prize.
